



T-Bridle Joint



Mortise and Tennon









It has a large surface area for gluing Most of the joint is hidden in the timber which makes it look attractive.

Dowel Joint






Dovetail Joints

Dovetouls are the Strongest of all joints
The joint is made up of a number of interlocking dovetouls and pins. Once glued it is very difficult to break a dovetoul joint. They are commonly used in high-class cabinet making, drawer construction and in decorative boxes.






<u>Advantages</u>
